Synopsis

Two estranged sisters are forced to rob a bank in order to save their brother. The heist begins smoothly, but mayhem ensues when the defiant bank manager sends them to a basement-level vault—home to something truly evil. Starring Academy Award® Nominee James Franco (SPIDER-MAN, 127 HOURS, PINEAPPLE EXPRESS) and Taryn Manning (ORANGE IS THE NEW BLACK, 8-MILE, SONS OF ANARCHY), THE VAULT is the latest film from genre writer/director Dan Bush (THE SIGNAL).

Director's Statement

THE VAULT is where heist meets horror; THE TOWN meets THE SHINING: a blend of two character-driven elevated genre films. It's a thrill ride into hell – hardcore, horrifying, and heartbreaking – driven by a bank robbery, vengeful ghosts and three siblings who must learn to trust each other or die.

Our story is set in modern day – inside a timeworn bank in a small, forgotten, working-class city. It could be any city. The building is a relic from another time – a time of opulence that allowed for marble floors and lofted ceilings – like a cathedral designed for the worship of wealth and yet haunted by the victims of that same materialism.

At its heart, THE VAULT is a loyalty play. Three estranged siblings are caught in a desperate situation that forces the resolution of life-long conflicts. This day will make or break them. It's love and a family bond versus fear and betrayal, forgiveness versus revenge, trust versus suspicion and this bank is the nightmarish battleground.

THE VAULT demands vulnerable, truthful performances. Actors hold the keys that unlock the script. As a director, it's my job to fight for conditions where the actors can be real, vulnerable, and organic. We'll be on one location for an extended period so they can settle in, get to know their surroundings, and begin to pull new ideas from within it. In this way, we'll make a movie that is truly terrifying in large part because the performances will be authentic, playing off the haunted bank itself.

This is a nonstop thrill ride. It opens with a gritty, heart-pounding bank heist. And as the siblings head for the underground vault, the story quickly ramps to a fast-paced, psychotic trip into darkness. It's also a real pressure cooker, as most of the movie is tightly contained inside the Century Trust Bank itself and especially the dark, terrifying, labyrinthine basement below. There's nowhere to run; our characters are pinned between the cops outside and the ghosts below. The stakes couldn't be higher. That containment – that claustrophobia – is key to a terrifying experience and will drive almost ever creative decision. When the violence does it, it will not be stylized or celebratory, it will be realistic and brutal. It will hurt.

Our camera will show you things you don't want to see and hide things that you think you need to see. Our angles will mirror the psychological states of our characters so that you too will feel the walls closing in. Our lenses will transform the bank into a

terrifying and deadly trap. At times, you'll creep and float through the halls and basement layers of the bank and spy on these characters like a spectre. Then, when things go horrible wrong, your view will become increasingly disorienting, off-kilter, unreliable. As night takes the bank and light gives way to shadow at every turn, you'll feel the same desperation and terror as Leah, Vee, and Michael.

You are going to be manipulated – not only visually, but through audio as well. The haunting, disorienting sound design and riveting score will rise and fall as you make your way down to the subterranean layers beneath the bank. At times pensive and dreadful, then paranoid and explosive, often with a deadly hum almost too low to hear, like the bank ghosts are whispering in your ears.

Ultimately, the bank becomes a main character too. Like the Overlook Hotel in THE SHINING: a manipulative, calculating nemesis that gets inside of you, deceives you, lies to you, then owns you completely until you can't trust anything anymore. Not even yourself.

THE VAULT James Franco, Actor – Biography

JAMES FRANCO is a multi-hyphenate actor, director, producer, author and university lecturer. He began receiving critical acclaim early on in his career, winning a Golden Globe for his portrayal of James Dean in TNT's 2001 biopic. Franco has been recognized with countless award nominations for both his comedic and dramatic work, including PINEAPPLE EXPRESS (Golden Globe nomination for Best Actor), SPRING BREAKERS, and 127 HOURS, the lattermost for which he received an Academy Award nomination for Best Actor.

Franco will next be seen in New Line's upcoming THE DISASTER ARTIST, which he directed and produced. Based on the book of the same name, the film recounts the making of THE ROOM, a cult classic now known as "the best worst movie ever made." The film debuted at the 2017 SXSW Film Festival, and features Franco alongside a stellar cast including Dave Franco, Seth Rogen, Zac Efron and Bryan Cranston.

This fall, Franco will take his talents to HBO with THE DEUCE, a series about the emergence of porn in NYC during the 1970s and '80s. Franco takes on the dual role of twins "Vincent" and "Frankie Martino," while also sharing producing duties with creator David Simon and serving as director for two of the ten episodes.

Franco began his career on the fan-favorite TV series FREAKS AND GEEKS, opposite friend and frequent collaborator Seth Rogen. The two have teamed up for some of the most beloved comedies of the past decade, including PINEAPPLE EXPRESS, THIS IS THE END and THE INTERVIEW. Franco's international success came by way of his role as "Harry Osborn" in Sam Raimi's SPIDERMAN trilogy. Shortly after wrapping the final installment, he returned to UCLA to complete his bachelor's degree in creative writing. He went on to receive MFAs from Columbia, NYU, RISD and Brooklyn College before enrolling at Yale University for his Ph.D., all while continuing to balance his acting and directing career. In addition to his film and educational work, Franco is a successful author with several books published to date.

Franco's commercial success has continued through the years with blockbuster films like OZ THE GREAT AND POWERFUL and WHY HIM. He returned to the small screen in 2016 for the well-received limited series 11.22.63, which he produced with J.J. Abrams. He is also an Emmy-nominated producer for his digital sketch series MAKING A SCENE, the third season of which premieres this year.

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Taryn Manning, Actor - Biography

Taryn Manning is an artistic phenomenon actress/singer/songwriter, and entrepreneur. She is currently starring in the 3-time SAG award-winning NETFLIX hit original series "Orange is the New Black" as the controversial religious zealot Pennsatucky, which returned for a fifth season in June 2017. Manning was also recently lauded as Michelle Knight, the young Cleveland woman who was kidnapped and held captive for 11 years, in the Sony and Lifetime TV movie "Cleveland Abduction." Among her other recent works is the coming of age independent drama film "A Light Beneath Their Feet," which received critical acclaim; and the Sundance-nominated "Low Down" (starring Glenn Close and Elle Fanning), executive produced by Mark Ruffalo and produced by Albert Berger and Ron Yerxa. She has given pivotal performances in "Experimenter" (starring Peter Sarsgaard and Winona Ryder) and "#Horror" starring Chloe Sevigny, and directed by Tara Subkoff.

Manning has also graced the screen in cinematic hit "Hustle & Flow," for which she was nominated for Best Breakthrough Performance by the Washington DC Film Critics' Association; and was nominated for a SAG Award for her performances in "8 Mile," "Crossroads," "Crazy/Beautiful," "Cold Mountain," "A Lot Like Love," "Dandelion, White Oleander," "Love Ranch," and "The Perfect Age of Rock N' Roll." Manning has also played acclaimed roles on television's major hitters – "Hawaii 5-0," "Melrose Place," "The Practice," "Boston Legal," "Burn Notice, CSI: Miami," "Sons of Anarchy" and "Law & Order: SVU," among others.

Manning continues to prove her longevity within the entertainment industry not only as an award-winning actor but as a musician, as well. Performing live in between her DJ sets is not uncommon for this front-woman. She has a history of Billboard chart-topping hits including her 2012 solo release "Send Me Your Love," which went #1 on Dance Club Play; and Boomkat's "The Wreckoning" and "What U Do 2 Me." Remixes climbed to #1 on Billboard's Hot Dance Music/Club Play chart, and Manning closed out 2003 as Billboard Magazine's Hot Dance Club Play Artist of the Year.

Manning's musical contribution to film and television is as in demand as her acting. Her tracks are often requested for soundtracks, including her soulful single "Wastin' My Time," which was personally licensed by Eminem and featured on the "8 Mile" soundtrack; Boomkat's remake of the Blondie song "Rip Her to Shreds" that can be heard in the opening credits of the film "Mean Girls"; and "The Wreckoning," which was

used in the opening scene of "The Italian Job"; and a number of solo tracks on episodes of the The CW's "Melrose Place" and "Hawaii 5-0."

A serial entrepreneur and constant creative, Manning has delved personally into directing and producing her own content for over a decade. Her goal has always been to encourage artists and creatives, leading by example. Her latest projects include GLTCHLFE Records and her production company Rainbows and Unicorns.

Francesca Eastwood, Actor – Biography

Francesca Eastwood is becoming one of Hollywood's rising stars. Eastwood recently starred in the SXSW festival film "MFA," in which she plays a college student who seeks vengeance after being sexually assaulted. She was the lead actress in "Outlaws and Angels" alongside Luke Wilson and Chad Michael Murray which premiered at the 2016 Sundance Film Festival. Francesca also stars in Angie Wang's "Cardinal X."

She can be seen this season on Showtime's "Twin Peaks" as well as FX's "Fargo." Additional TV credits include: NBC's "Heroes Reborn."

Eastwood starred in the production workshop of "Big Sky" at the Geffen Playhouse, written by Alexandra Gersten Vassilaros and directed by John Rando.

Eastwood was granted the honor of being Miss Golden Globe at the 2013 awards ceremony.

She is based in Los Angeles.

THE VAULT Scott Haze, Actor - Biography

Scott Haze is an American actor, writer, and director best known for his breakout role in the 2014 film "Child Of God," directed by James Franco and based on the novel by Cormac McCarthy. He will next be seen in Sony's "Granite Mountain" opposite Josh Brolin and Jeff Bridges, and Universal/DreamWorks' "Thank You For Your Service" opposite Miles Teller from director Jason Hall, both of which will hit theaters in the fall of 2017.

Haze's other film credits include Jeff Nichols' "Midnight Special" opposite Michael Shannon and Joel Edgerton, and "Between Us" opposite Olivia Thirlby. Haze also starred in multiple James Franco films, such as "The Institute," "In Dubious Battle," "The Sound and The Fury," "As I Lay Dying," and "Bukowski."

THE VAULT Clifton Collins Jr., Actor – Biography

An acting chameleon, Clifton Collins Jr. can easily lose himself in the lives of his film and television characters, with memorable roles in blockbuster projects including TRAFFIC, CAPOTE, ONE EIGHT SEVEN and PACIFIC RIM.

Playing a variety of characters—from policemen to boxers to serial killers—and working with illustrious industry vets including Guillermo del Toro, Terrence Malick and Wally Pfister, Collins, a native Angeleno, grew up destined to become a part of the entertainment industry. His grandfather was well-known character actor Pedro Gonzalez Gonzalez, most famous for his humorous sidekick roles in 1950s/1960s John Wayne westerns. Clifton follows in his grandfather's footsteps on the critically-acclaimed science fiction drama WESTWORLD for HBO, where he plays Lawrence, a slippery criminal wanted for misdeeds across the West alongside Ed Harris, Anthony Hopkins, James Marsden, Evan Rachel Wood, and Jeffrey Wright. He added his own personal touch to the character, wearing his grandfather's gun belt throughout the series.

2016 was another huge year for the seasoned actor with roles in both major film and television projects. Collins had a starring role in the Open Road thriller TRIPLE 9 alongside Woody Harrelson, Casey Affleck, Chiwetel Ejiofor and Kate Winslet, which he followed with a role in Terrence Malick's KNIGHT OF CUPS, opposite Christian Bale, Rooney Mara, Natalie Portman, Michael Fassbender, Cate Blanchett, Ryan Gosling, and Benicio Del Toro. Additionally, he played one of the lead roles in the SXSW audience favorite TRANSPECOS, which centers around three Border Patrol agents working a remote desert checkpoint, who discover that the contents of one car reveal an insidious plot within their own ranks.

2017 aims to be just as big for Clifton with the return of WESTWORLD and 3 films at this year's SXSW—Terrence Malick's SONG TO SONG, opposite Ryan Gosling, Natalie Portman, Rooney Mara, and Michael Fassbender; Eshom & Ian Nelms' SMALL TOWN CRIME, in which he stars alongside Anthony Anderson, John Hawkes, and Octavia Spencer; and Natalia Leite's thriller M.F.A. in which Clifton stars as 'Detective Kennedy' alongside Francesca Eastwood. Clifton can also be seen this year in Trevor White's A CROOKED SOMEBODY, where he stars alongside Rich Sommer and Ed Harris as a murderer who wants to make peace with a victim, only to be taken advantage of by a phony psychic medium.

Previous film credits include: Wally Pfister-directed feature TRANSCENDENCE opposite Johnny Depp, Morgan Freeman, Kate Mara, and Cillian Murphy; Dito Montiel's MAN DOWN opposite Shia Labeouf and Gary Oldman; Taylor Hackford's feature PARKER, opposite Jason Statham and Jennifer Lopez; the Lionsgate feature THE PERFECT GAME; Paul Scheuring's film THE EXPERIMENT opposite Adrien Brody and Forrest Whitaker; and the Universal feature SCOTT PILGRIM VS. THE WORLD. Clifton's previous and notable feature credits include: Jim Sheridan's BROTHERS, with Jake Gyllenhaal; JJ Abrams' STAR TREK; Mike Judge's EXTRACT opposite Ben Affleck; SUNSHINE CLEANING opposite Emily Blunt and Amy Adams; BOONDOCK SAINTS 2 for Sony; CAPOTE; and has also created memorable characters in such varied projects as BABEL, TRAFFIC, TIGERLAND and RULES OF ATTRACTION. In addition to his work in film and television, Collins recently co-authored the book Prison Ramen: Recipes and Stories from Behind Bars with Gustavo "Goose" Alvarez, a former California prison system inmate and childhood friend of Collins, which includes a foreword from legendary actor Samuel L. Jackson. The book is full of creative ramen recipes, along with stories from ex-cons, including former celebrity inmates/Collins' friends Slash, Shia LaBeouf, Taryn Manning and Danny Trejo. A unique and edgy cookbook, Prison Ramen takes readers behind bars with more than 65 ramen recipes and first-person accounts of life inside prison—a scared-straight reality to complement the offbeat recipes. Proceeds from the book benefit Homeboy Industries, an organization that focuses on gang rehabilitation and a re-entry program after prison.

THE VAULT Dan Bush, Director/Writer – Biography

Dan Bush is an American director, writer, producer, and editor. In 2007, Dan co-wrote and co-directed THE SIGNAL. The film premiered at the Sundance Film Festival and was bought by Magnolia Pictures. THE SIGNAL was released theatrically and nominated for several awards, including Best Picture at the Sitges Film Festival and the John Cassavetes Award at the Independent Spirit Awards. In 2012, Dan co-wrote and directed THE PROXY, a sci-fi thriller starring Amy Seimetz (YOU'RE NEXT) and Melissa McBride (THE WALKING DEAD), and GHOST OF OLD HIGHWAYS which has won 19 festival awards. He is currently developing "Prototype" with New Regency (FIGHT CLUB, TWELVE YEARS A SLAVE) and a sci-fi thriller SHUT-EYE. Additionally, he has two more features in the works: THE INNOCENTS and AURORA.

THE VAULT Conal Byrne, Writer – Biography

Conal Byrne is a screenwriter and actor. He wrote and starred in the sci-fi thriller THE PROXY, directed by Dan Bush (THE SIGNAL) and starring Amy Seimetz (YOU'RE NEXT). This year, he is producing two independent films in the sci-fi/horror genre in Atlanta through Hive Mind Media with directors Dan Bush and David Bruckner (THE SIGNAL, VHS). He co-wrote THE VAULT with Dan Bush and is currently co-writing with Bradley Cooper a screenplay based on the well-known sci-fi book series HYPERION with GK Films.

THE VAULT Tom Butterfield, Producer – Biography

Tom has worked in both the UK and US film industry for over 12 years. This has included time spent at every type of production company (including a Hollywood studio, an independent production company, and a government body). This experience has given him an extensive understanding of how to get a script ready to be financed and produced. Tom worked for Zide/Perry Productions in Los Angeles. At the time Zide/Perry was the most financially successful independent production company in Hollywood with Universal Studios as its mother studio. They produced the box-office smash AMERICAN PIE trilogy as well as the FINAL DESTINATION series. After returning from Los Angeles, Tom worked for the UK Film Council in the New Cinema Fund. This fund was designed to help upcoming writers/directors with their first features. During his 3 years at the UKFC he worked as an executive of Award winning films including the Academy Award winning MAN ON WIRE, RED ROAD, THE WIND THAT SHAKES THE BARLEY, and LONDON TO BRIGHTON.

THE VAULT Luke Daniels, Producer – Biography

Luke was born in Stamford, Connecticut and later moved to Washington, DC where he earned a Bachelor's Degree in Business from Georgetown University. After starting and selling two successful businesses, he moved to Los Angeles to pursue an acting and film career where he landed recurring roles on General Hospital and Port Charles. In 2007, Luke moved behind the camera to concentrate full time on the business side of the film industry by founding Redwire Pictures, LLC. In 2008 and 2009, he produced the feature films CIRCLE and HYSTERICAL PSYCHO. CIRCLE, directed by Michael W. Watkins, had a worldwide release in the fall of 2009. HYSTERICAL PSYCHO, directed by Dan Fogler, was released worldwide in 2013. In 2012, Luke produced the feature film DON PEYOTE, starring Josh Duhamel, Oscar-winner Anne Hathaway, Jay Baruchel, Topher Grace, Annabella Sciorra, and Dan Fogler—which was released theatrically in May of 2014. In 2013, Luke produced the feature films LURID, starring Vinnie Jones, LIKE SUNDAY LIKE RAIN, directed by Frank Whaley and starring Leighton Meester, ANY DAY starring Sean Bean and Eva Longoria, WELCOME TO ME, starring Kristen Wiig and Tim Robbins, MARIAH, MURDER 11, and THE TAKING.
